Additional Healing Prayer Available

At times when we pray for healing, by God's grace, we experience amazing results right away. We might experience pain disappearing, or a burden lifted from our heart in a way that we feel we are forever transformed, or we might even see a physical transformation before our eyes.

These are signs that proclaim Christ's good news, "the kingdom of God is at hand!" Often, however, healing will take place over time, with continuing in-depth prayer. Successful healing ministries, and Jesus himself, counsels us to continue to pray over time, calling upon the Holy Spirit to penetrate more fully and deeply for ongoing healing.



About Taizé

Vision

Protestant pastor Roger Schutz-Marsauche founded the Taizé community in 1940. In 1945 the first brothers, all Protestant, arrived from Switzerland. Today the community is made up of more than 100 brothers from different Christian faiths and more than 25 different countries

Taizé (pronounced: tay-zay) is a prayerful form of music known for its simple, yet rich and meditative character. Taizé music often takes the structure of an ostinato (a simple melody that repeats over and over) and is meant to serve as a kind of musical centering prayer.

Community

Taizé is a small village in France that is home to an ecumenical community of one hundred Catholic and Protestant monks from around the world. They are devoted to the idea of peace through meditation, silence and prayer.

Taizé has become one of the world's most important sites of Christian pilgrimage, with a focus on youth. **Over 100,000 young people from around the world** make pilgrimages to Taizé each year for prayer, Bible study, sharing, and communal work.

Meditative Songs

Singing is one of the most important forms of prayer. A few words sung over and over again reinforce the meditative quality of the prayer. They express a basic reality of faith that can quickly be grasped by the intellect and that gradually penetrates the heart and the whole being.

These simple chants also provide a way of praying when one is alone, during the day or at night, or even in the silence of one's heart while one is working.

Icons in Worship

Icons contribute to the beauty of worship. They are like windows open on the realities of the kingdom of God making them present in our prayer on earth.

Although icons are images, they are not simply illustrations or decorations. They are symbols of the incarnation, a presence which offers to the eye the spiritual message that the Word addresses to the ear.
